Under Finance, we have Resolutions 20 19 20 through 24. And just as a comment I think for the --21 primarily Carla, for you as a new 22 23 Commissioner, --24 COMMISSIONER STANZIALE: Um-hum. 25 COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: -- annually we do

2	and we create these pools. So, we've been
3	approving a number of those pools and we see,
4	again, for our financial advisors and
5	underwriting firms.
6	But if there are any other questions
7	related to 20 through 24?
8	MR. PAGANELLI: Could I just make two
9	points on 20 through 24?
10	One is that as the Board knows timely we
11	submitted our budget to the State. The State
12	asked and our Resolution at the time indicated
13	that we would have we would have it listed
14	again for tonight. DCA at the State asked us to
15	hold-off while they were reviewing it until
16	December.
17	So, it's our anticipation that it should be
18	approved and we'll get it back in December for
19	action.
20	We haven't even gotten any questions, so we
21	just assume that they're backed up like everybody
22	else is.
23	The other thing the other issue is 23
24	and 24, the SEC, back in 2009, came out with new
25	and more comprehensive disclosure requirements

really trying to make sure that things in the finance world are as transparent as possible and making sure that issuers are disclosing to the financial markets a lot of different occurrences.

5 So if you have a -- if your bond rating 6 changes or different things happen, you should 7 file notice of those happenings on something that 8 we call EMMA, E-M-M-A.

9 But, quite frankly, I think Jersey lags
10 behind us, County Utility Authority -- for our
11 family -- lag behind in these reporting
12 requirements. And so at the County level the
13 other night we passed a similar resolution.

And, basically, what we've done is -- we just did deals in 2004, we did an Airport deal and we did a County Re-funding deal. At that time we went back and made sure that all disclosures that should have been made over the last several years were made.

20 So we are now current on the EMMA system if
21 you went there and looked at it.

Then the other issue was to review all of our official offering statements and see if we made representations in those offering statements that were not true. So, for instance, in 2010 if we did a deal
 or the County did a deal and within that offering
 statement it was represented that the County had
 filed all their right financial disclosures but
 in reality had not.

6 The County now is going to embark on a 7 process where it's going to correct that and 8 probably do something called self-report to the 9 SEC to avoid fines and things like that.

It's as of December 1st, if you just selfreport, it's -- you know, unless there's something glaring there, it will be kind of -- it just goes away.

So we've done that at the County level for the Utility Authority. We've done that at the County level for the County body itself.

17 And then we started to embark on that 18 process here. Lucy and I have been reviewing 19 bond documents and then finally brought on John 20 Draikiwicz, who's outside bond counsel, and 21 ACACIA to help us to see did we miss -- did we 22 promise in one of our disclosures that we would 23 disclose something and not do it.

So we went through this on the conferencecall with counsel and the FA the other day; in

fact, we had not. We had never made a
 representation of disclosure. Because really
 under our documents most of our financings are
 conduit financings for others. They have the
 disclosure obligation.

Furthermore, we have continuing disclosure
agreements that we've entered into that requires
that the trustee file every -- file all these
disclosures for us.

We didn't really know that we didn't have anything percolating until late and that's why these are still listed. We'd like them to passthrough. But we don't think there's \$7500.00 -and we're not going to come close to that. It's a couple hours work probably.

We may enlist a company called DAC, D-A-C; if we do, we'll bring it back to the Board. But that company helps issuers with these types of financial disclosures.

And while we're confident that we have the right trustees in place and we're confident in our disclosure agreements, for a real modest cost DAC may provide a backup system to us. And so it may be something that, you know, we'll bring to the Board -- the last quote I think we got was

1 like \$1500.00.

2 To make us all sleep a little bit easier at 3 night, --

4 COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Um-hum.
5 MR. PAGANELLI: -- to know that we were
6 doing our disclosures, we probably will enlist
7 them.

8 So, we will have the County now hopefully
9 filing the right disclosures on their stuff,
10 which really kind of grabs some of our stuff.
11 Because our bond rating's based on what the
12 County bond rating is.

We'll have our own -- now kind of a little
We'll have our own -- now kind of a little
bit more sensitive to some issues -- we'll have
the trustee that's supposed to be doing it for us
contractually; and then we'll have DAC.

So I think on a go-forward we'll beprotected.

19 But that's what those two resolutions are 20 getting at.

21 COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: So we're getting22 right with everything.

23 MR. PAGANELLI: We are. The world is24 right.

25

COMMISSIONER TORO: Yes. 3 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Excuse me? 4 Just one question, Jim. 5 6 If we know, as Lucy said that we do it 7 twice, why don't we just do it once instead of 8 buying it twice a year? 9 If we know we're going to use 200,000, why 10 don't we just buy 200,000 initially? MS. SAPINSKI: Because it's so many boxes, 11 12 there is no place to store them. 13 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Oh, okay. COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: I was about to 14 15 say, let them store it. 16 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Oh, okay. 11	COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Just sell it for

29 It's a great location. You know it's right 1 by the train station. 2 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Um-hum. 3 MR. PAGANELLI: It's right by the Light 4 Rail. It's right by 280. It's right by 21. 5 It's on Broad Street. It's right across the 6 7 street from Rutgers. It's right across the 8 street from NJIT. So I think it does have some value to it. 9 And probably we shouldn't have offered a 10 minimum. We should have just gone and just see 11 12 what the value was. And we had a very, very short time frame. 13 So we had a minimum bid of \$30 million. We 14 had it on the street returnable on the 11th of 15 16 November and we wanted to close by December 31st. 17 So, --COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: That's aggressive. 18 MR. PAGANELLI: Yeah, unless someone's 19 20 coming up with \$30 million out of their back pocket it's difficult to put that kind of 21 financing together. 22 So, we'll try to rotate to next year and 23 see how it goes. swap for in-kind services.

As the Board knows we took upon the leases for the field equipment. We took upon the lease for the scoreboard. We hired a guy that was with the Bears that was doing the field.

So now those costs have rotated to us. If somehow I could rotate those costs back out and then, --

18 MR. PAGANELLI: -- you know, offer it to
19 the City and local towns for, you know, Thursday
20 night baseball in the city, I think it would be
21 fun. But we have to see how it goes.

22 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Will the Board send23 anything up here about our winter maintenance?
