          MR. ROTHER: Yeah. Okay.
          Yeah. After -- after our review of the
8

    initial amendment to the sub-lease, we sent it
10
    back to County Counsel, and it was amended to
11
    reflect only an increase in the monthly rent, and
12
    -- and to permit the sale of alcoholic beverages
13
    in -- in plastic containers and on draft, but in
14
    no other fashion.

          We understand that the lease is going to be
16
    on the agenda for approval by the Freeholders
17
    this evening.

          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: Can you explain
19
    exactly what our legal relationship is here?
20
          MR. ROTHER: Sure. Sure.

          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: The Improvement

    Authority?

          MR. ROTHER: Yes.

          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: Is it pronounced

Aramark? Am I correct? I'm not sure if I'm

          MR. ROTHER: Aramark, yes.

          Here's -- and -- and I should make one

    disclosure which -- which we'll -- we'll get to

          This is a property that is owned by the
7
    County. It is leased to the Improvement
8
    Authority, and then it is sub-leased to Aramark,
9
    for the purpose of vending food at Turtle Back
10
    Zoo.

          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: And --
          MR. ROTHER: The -- the initial lease did
12

    not permit the -- the sale of alcoholic
14
    beverages.
15
          Because the property is owned by
16
    governmental entities, the sub-tenant is
17
    permitted to get what is called a
18
    concessionaire's liquor license directly from the
19
    State, even though the municipality in which the
20
    property is located may be oversubscribed with
21
    regard to liquor licenses, there's a special
22
    annual concessionaire's license that they can
23
    secure directly from the State ABC, under these
24
    circumstances. And that's what they plan to do.
25
          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: And is our sub-lease

    limited to the concession stand? Or is it any
2
    other part of the --

          MR. ROTHER: No. It's the entire food
4
    vending operation at Turtle Back Zoo.
5
          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: But not the rest
6
    of the zoo.

          MR. ROTHER: No.
8
          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Okay.
9
          MR. ROTHER: No.
10
          And --
11
          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Just --
12
          MR. ROTHER: And I should just point out
13
    one thing, that -- that in the past, my firm has
    represented Aramark on liquor licensing matters.

    And I did not participate at all in the
    negotiation of these terms. This was done
16
17
    exclusively through County Counsel's Office.
18
          The only thing that I did was review an
19
    initial draft to point out some illegalities in
20
    -- in the way they were pursuing it, and so that
21
    they could make the corrections.
22
          The -- Aramark may come to our firm -- I
23
    don't do the liquor work, by the way -- may come
24
    to our firm at some point in time and ask for
```

advice. But that would be all post your action

          And, of course, I didn't participate in any
3
    way in negotiating these terms.
4
          CHAIRMAN KLINGHOFFER: Thank you.
5
          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Thank you.
6
          COMMISSIONER ROSS: Steve, this is -- this

    is Cliff.
          Has any additional insurance been purchased
8
9
    to cover the selling of alcohol?
10
          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Yeah. I was
11
    curious about that, as well.

          MR. ROTHER: That -- that is not something
13
    that is included, except there is a large
    indemnification provision, which -- which I am
14
15
    sure is what the County was looking to.
16
          There -- there is insurance in -- in the
    initial contract, but a -- just an
17

    indemnification here.

          COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Yeah. Actually,
20
    this building -- building on with Commissioner
21
    Ross was saying, I was just -- are we comfortable
22
    that we're not in a liability situation here, if
23
    something should happen as a result of somebody
24
    -- you know, being served, or whatever the case
25
    may be?

          Steve, do you feel as if we're -- we're

    adequately protected on the liability side?

          MR. ROTHER: I -- I believe we are. You

    know, we -- we are immune from most of these

          That's not to say that somebody can't sue
