- 7 | Improvement Authority agreed that it would
- 8 | indemnify and defend and hold harmless Celanese
- 9 for any discharges off that property in their
- 10 course of their ownership.
- I think some of you may be aware that there
- 12 was a Spill Act case involving the Passaic River.
- 13 There's also federal lawsuits involving the
- 14 river.
- We're brought into the litigation by
- 16 | Celanese. The initial position of the
- 17 | Improvement Authority was that it never intended
- 18 to indemnify them for their acts. Ultimately
- 19 that lawsuit was unsuccessful.
- We now have an outside attorney; his name
- 21 | is James O'Toole. I think the Board -- the
- 22 present Board members would agree he's been
- 23 tremendous. It's been expensive but it's -- he's
- 24 been a tremendous asset for us.
- 25 And he is now walking us through the
