- 10 What they purported to do this time was
 11 mirror that one, which we thought would be kind
 12 of pretty quick -- okay, they did it back then,
 13 so we'll do it now; there's really not much to
 14 say about it.
 - But when we reviewed what they had executed back then they were -- the Improvement Authority was relinquishing its rights to condemnation proceeds if that parcel ever got condemned by the -- I guess the feds or the state. Whoever is -- has a higher sovereign power than we do at the Improvement Authority.
 - And so when we analyzed that we recognized that the Improvement Authority, as the owner of the fee and the future owner of that building when the lease terminates, has interests that may

- 1 | be condemned out. And if we did have our
- 2 | interest condemned out, those proceeds should not
- 3 go to the bank to pay down the loan.
- 4 So, it caused a few weeks of --
- 5 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Back and forth.
- 6 MR. PAGANELLI: -- nasty-grams between me
- 7 and the attorney for the bank to try to get them
- 8 to understand, while we didn't necessarily care
- 9 | if the building owner got condemned out and his
- 10 interest when to pay his loan -- that's how he
- 11 | was getting his loan, we were not going to allow
- 12 | our interest to be condemned out and for them to
- 13 receive our money.
- 14 So that's kind of why we wanted to lift
- 15 | that -- list that one for Additional Information,
- just so that we're all aware of how we handled
