And Covanta, who is the operator of the 21 22 incinerator, has now posted an escrow with us, because we're incurring some bills, which they'll 23 recapture when we ultimately do the financing. 24 25 We hope to get it done by the end of this

2	that hope and see how it goes.
3	But, right now, it's a volume cap issue
4	with the State. The State seems so inclined to
5	get it to us, and so, hopefully, we'll get things

7	COMMISSIONER SPIESBACH: Um hum.

9	finalized and this gets done. It's important to
10	the East Ward of Newark.
